As I have always had an interest in the workings of the human body, a passion for health and a desire to serve others in my community, I have chosen to study medicine.


After receiving my Year 12 results I accepted my offer of the Chancellor's Scholarship in the Bachelor of Biomedicine at the University of Melbourne.


